CALL FOR PAPER COMPETITION

for the “Professor Slobodan Perović” Award

Award is presented for the best three papers submitted by young participants of the Kopaonik School of Natural Law, addressing the theme of

LAW AND THE POWER OF MIND

to honour the memory of the founder of the Kopaonik School of Natural Law Academician Prof. Dr. Slobodan Perović

The Award is accompanied with a total prize money of 2.250 EUR in RSD countervalue, and the winners of the first, second and third prize will receive respectively 1000 EUR, 750 EUR and 500 EUR in RSD countervalue. This year, the award fund for the “Professor Slobodan Perović” Award is provided by the family of the founder of the Kopaonik School of Natural Law, Academician Prof. Dr. Slobodan Perović. In addition to the cash prize, the winners will also receive a *Litteras Honoris* diploma, as well as a special award of the panel of judges. The closing date for submissions is 30 August 2019.

The winners will be announced and awarded at the opening plenary session of the 32nd Conference of the Kopaonik School of Natural Law – Slobodan Perović, on the 13th of December 2019.

The competition is open to all participants of the Kopaonik School of Natural Law whose age does not exceed 35, including undergraduate and postgraduate students of law. Papers should be submitted in Serbian or English and follow the length and other requirements as set out in the Guidelines for the Authors accompanying this Call for Paper Competition.

Papers shall be evaluated by a panel of experts composed of:

Papers should be sent in electronic format, as Word files, to konkurs@kopaonickaskola.rs and inquiries about receipt may be addressed to jperovic@beotel.rs. The information about the author (full name, professional title and occupation, full address, contact phone and e-mail, and for students also the number of the university record booklet and year/level of studies) should be provided in a cover letter, and no information about the author should appear in the paper itself, since a special panel shall make all submissions anonymous prior to forwarding them to the panel of judges for reading and evaluation. The cover letter should indicate that the paper is submitted in response to the Call for Paper Competition for the “Professor Slobodan Perović” Award.

GUIDELINES FOR THE AUTHORS

The length of a paper may not exceed 20 pages, and the authors shall use Times New Roman with a font size 12, line spacing 1,5.

The full name of the author shall be given in the top left corner, and the author's institutional affiliation, professional title and occupation shall be given in the footnote.

The Abstract, presenting the key findings, shall be given at the beginning of the paper, and shall not exceed 14 lines and 5 key words. The Summary in English, containing the same number of lines and key words as the Abstract, shall be provided at the end of the paper, and the professional title and occupation of the author in English shall be given above the Summary, in the top left corner. The Abstract and Summary shall be in the same font and spacing as the paper.

The title of the paper shall be centred, uppercase, boldface, in font 14. The first level subheadings shall be centred, uppercase, font 12. The second level subheadings shall be centred, lowercase, with the first word capitalised, italicised, in font 12. The third level subheadings shall be given at the beginning of the line, in lowercase, with the first word capitalised, italicised, in font 12, followed by a period and an en dash.

Footnotes are given beneath the text, using Times New Roman, font size 10, small case, line spacing 1,5.

Papers shall be submitted in an electronic form.

The editors retain the right to adapt the paper to the general rules of journal editing and the standards of Serbian language.

CITATION FORMAT

1. Books shall be cited as follows: the initial of the given name (followed by a period) and the last name of the author, the title of the book italicised, the place of publication, the year of publication, the page number. If the publisher is cited, it is usually given immediately before the place of publication. The full name of the author is given only for the first citation.

Example: Jovan Jovanović, *Građansko pravo*, Savremena administracija, Beograd, 2004, p.144.

In case of multiple authors, there shall be a comma between each author.

Example: Jovan Jovanović, Marko Marković, *Građansko pravo*, Savremena administracija, Beograd, 2004, p.144.

2. Papers shall be cited as follows: the initial of the given name (followed by a period) and the last name of the author, the title of the paper – usually between quotation marks, the title of the journal in italics, the issue number, the place of publication if available, and the year of publication and the page number. If the journal is published in volumes, the volume number is given after the issue number. The full name of the author is given only for the first citation.

Example: Jovan Jovanović, „Pravna priroda ugovora o arbitraži”, *Pravni život*, No.11, Vol III, Beograd, 2004, p.144.

In case of multiple authors, there shall be a comma between each author.

Example: Jovan Jovanović, Marko Marković, „Pravna priroda ugovora o arbitraži”, *Pravni život*, No.11, Vol III, Beograd, 2004, p.144.

If the paper is published in conference proceedings or a book edited by another person, it shall be cited as follows: the initial of the given name (followed by a period) and the last name of the author, the title of the paper – usually between quotation marks, the title of the conference proceedings or the book in italics followed by the indication Editor or Ed. and the full name of the editor given in the parentheses, the issue number if available, the place of publication, the year of publication, page number.

Example: Jovan Jovanović, „Poverljivost u arbitraži”, *Rešavanje sporova iz međunarodnih poslovnih ugovora* (Editor Marko Marković), No. 3, Beograd, 2004, p.210.

3. In case of citing a text from several specific pages, they are separated by hyphen and followed by a period. If pages are not specified, the number of the first page is followed by „ff” and a period.

Example: J. Jovanović, „Pravna priroda ugovora o arbitraži”, *Pravni život*, No.11, Vol III, Beograd, 2004, p.144 - 169.

J. Jovanović, „Pravna priroda ugovora o arbitraži”, *Pravni život*, No.11, Vol III, Beograd, 2004, p.144 ff.

4. If the data from the same page of the same work as in the preceding footnote is cited, the term „Ibidem” shall be used, italicised, followed by a period, without giving the name of the author.

Example: *Ibidem*.

If the data from the same work as in the preceding footnote is cited, but from a different page, the term „Ibidem” shall be used, italicised, followed by the relevant page and a period.

Example: *Ibidem*, p.101.

5. The full name of a regulation shall be cited, followed by the title of the journal where it was published, in italics, and the number of issue and the year of publication.

Example: *Zakon o udruženjima, Službeni glasnik RS, br.51/2009*

Article, Paragraph and Item of the regulation shall be abbreviated to Art., Para. and It. and the last number shall not be followed by a period.

Example: Art.4, Para.3, It.10

6. Citations of court decisions shall contain full reference if possible (type and number of the decision, the date of issue, where it was published).

7. The words of Latin and foreign origin, internet addresses, etc, shall be italicised.

8. Website quotations shall contain the title of the cited text, the internet address in italics and the date of accessing the page.
