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FOREWORD

The International Congress of the International Academy of Comparative Law, due to be held in Montreal from August 9-14 will be the thirteenth in the series. For the fifth time the Italian Association of Comparative Law has prepared a volume containing Italian reports over most of the topics chosen for discussion at the Congress.

As usual, the two general reports, entrusted this year to Professor Rodolfo Sacco and Professor Diego Corapi, are not included in the volume.
